ATLANTA--The Catholic Foundation of North Georgia made the following grants at its November meeting, according to board chairman Clarence H. Smith.

Deacon Ray Egan requested a grant to be used for surveying and mapping historic Catholic cemeteries located in outlying areas of the Archdiocese of Atlanta. The board approved the sum of \$10,000.

The Archdiocese of Atlanta Eucharistic Congress requested funds for marketing/sponsorship materials to help a volunteer-driven sponsorship committee to create a more self-sufficient event in 2009. The board approved \$30,000.

Catholic Charities asked funds for Teenquest, a new program that addresses the problems of immigrant children and their families. The grant award of \$10,000 is for a website and blog for immigrant teens.

Our Lady of the Assumption Catholic School requested assistance with funding a new roof, and was awarded \$15,000.

PATH-(Post Abortion Treatment and Healing)-requested money for community education, website and materials development, and scholarships to their "Rachel's Vineyard Retreats," which help with healing and reconciliation. The board approved \$10,000.

Southern Catholic College requested scholarship funding for Hispanic and Latino students and was awarded \$10,000.
